Unchain My Heart: A Tribute to Ray Charles featuring Joe McBride October 26-29, 2017

Jazz great, Joe McBride, takes on the role of blues legend Ray Charles, in this tour de force solo performance and tribute to one of music's greatest icons. McBride electrifies the stage with musical renditions of the Ray Charles songbook creating a memorable evening. Both Charles and McBride persevered to overcome the challenges of a sensory disability to make their mark in the music industry. Langston Hughes' holiday classic returns to the BATC stage under the direction of homegrown talent, Jiles King. He was the first Chief Executive Artistic Director of The Black Academy of Arts and Letters and also served as an Associate Producer with the Tony Award winning Negro Ensemble Company, Miller Theatre, Harlem School of the Arts and several other Off-Broadway companies. His gritty and fresh direction of the holiday favorite is sure to bring a new energy to this BATC time-honored production.

Actor Selmore Haines, III reprises his critically acclaimed role as the civil rights activist and social justice champion Thurgood Marshall. *Thurgood*, written by George Stevens, Jr., is a dramatic reflection of the life and legacy of NAACP legal counsel and the first African-American U.S. Supreme Court Justice. Marshall spent his life standing in the vanguard for education and social equality which eventually led to his appointment to the highest court in the nation. Fort Worth's Jubilee Theatre and BATC partner to re-stage a crowd favorite, bringing this powerful production to Dallas audiences. *Thurgood* is a must see for all in celebration of Black History Month. Returning as director is Dr. Harry Parker, Chair of Texas Christian University's Department of Theatre, and he also serves as Managing Director of TCU's Trinity Shakespeare Festival.

Banned Together: A Censorship Cabaret, In partnership with the Dramatists Legal Defense Fund September 24-29, 2018

Banned Together is a provocative cabaret-style performance showcasing excerpts from Tony Award winning plays and musicals such as *Rent, Cabaret, Fun Home*, and *Angels in America* during national Banned Books Week. In partnership with the Dramatists Legal Defense Fund, these productions are widely challenged by those who desire to censor the literary community due to the content and/or language of works. However, they find their voices again on the BATC stage. Working with our TNT (Teenagers And Theatre) Apprenticeship program, Banned Together educates teen and adult audiences of how theatre and the arts can inspire conversations, activism, and challenge our mindsets. *BANNED TOGETHER* IS SUITABLE FOR AUDIENCES AGES 13 AND ABOVE.
